Tell us a little about Variantyx - what is the nature of your work?



Nearly 30 million people in the US are affected by a rare disease. The overwhelming majority of these diseases are genetic in origin,


and many of the individuals affected are children. Variantyx is a diagnostic lab that provides genetic testing for diagnosis of these rare inherited disorders. We use whole genome sequencing (WGS) technology to look at a patient's entire DNA in order to identify the molecular change that is responsible for their symptoms.

You've developed your Genomic Intelligence® platform. How is the platform important and what does it mean for the future of diagnostics?

There are lots of home-grown and commercial software platforms that have been developed to analyze, interpret and report sequencing data. The Genomic Intelligence® platform stands out as unique in its class for a number of reasons. First, it was designed from the beginning to work with WGS data, which is the most informative but also the most complex type of sequencing data that can be generated. Where other platforms started with simpler data formats and have had to be incrementally retrofitted in order to handle the increased volume and complexity, Genomic Intelligence® was built and optimized with WGS data in mind from the start. Second, it was built by a clinical diagnostic lab and not by a software company. Our clinical geneticists use the platform daily to process our WGS-based Variantyx Unity™ test for diagnosis of rare inherited disorders. This clinical expertise has been critical to the platform's development and is the cornerstone of our unique ability to additionally enable other labs who are just getting started working with newer sequencing technologies to quickly develop, validate and launch new genetic tests of their own.

Who will benefit most from the platform's development?

Many people throughout the healthcare industry will benefit. Labs that work with the platform will be able to streamline their operations, processing more genetic tests at a lower overall cost. Insurance companies that embrace whole genome testing will benefit from paying fewer individual claims as rare disease patients no longer need to bounce from one negative test result to another as part of a long diagnostic odyssey. But at the end of the day, its rare disease patients and their families who will benefit the most by having access to affordable, WGS technology that provides the best chance to identify the molecular cause of their symptoms.

Switching gears, tell us why you chose Framingham to locate the company?

There were many factors that went into the decision, but the most important were space and accessibility. We're also looking forward to bringing whole genome testing to the broader consumer market, providing screening options for healthy individuals who want to learn more about genetic factors that have the potential to affect their future health.

Framingham Is Open for Business - 30 Speen Street

Up to 40,000 Square Feet Available Near Retail, Restaurants, and Other Businesses

With over 40,000 square feet and in close proximity to a plethora of retail, restaurant and service options, [30 Speen Street](#) currently has space available for lease for tenants needing between 1,500 to 40,000 square feet

of office and work space. Situated directly off Exit 13 on the Massachusetts Turnpike, the five-floor property offers excellent access to the region's major highway systems and three local MBTA Commuter Rail Stations.

Amenities within the building include a "grab & go" micro market with seating and collaboration areas, a common conference room, changing rooms and showers, and a bike storage area. Renovations of the lobby, common areas, and restrooms are



scheduled for 2019. Outside, the building provides 127 parking spaces and an opportunity for prominent and visible building signage.

Within short walking distance to one of the largest, amenity-rich retail districts in New England, 30 Speen Street is flanked by two of the largest malls in the area, Shoppers World and the Natick Mall. Additionally, the site is near a number of businesses, including Lifetime Fitness, IDG, S2 Security Corporation, and Punchbowl, Inc. The vibrant Golden Triangle area is home to a robust mix of 120 restaurants, 26 coffee shops, 20 bars, 29 fitness studios, and nine hotels.
